




# Andean bears spotted inside Machu Picchu!

This astonishing recent video clip of a female spectacled bear and her cub strolling among the Incan walls of the UNESCO Historic Sanctuary of Machu Picchu, is testimony to the wonders travelers may encounter while a limited number of people are allowed to enter the site. Fewer visitors have led to wildlife being more active in nature destinations around the world. The Lost City of the Incas is no exception evidenced by this fortuitous video filmed by a Peruvian visitor to the citadel.

Machu Picchu, tucked away in the cloud forest of Peru at 7,973 ft is the habitat of the Andean spectacled bears. Southwind's President Tom Damon was lucky enough to spot one while on a trek along the Inca Trail. Once prolific throughout mountain regions of South America, these bears are considered threatened due to habitat loss and hunting. Inkaterra has a Spectacled Bear Conservation Project located on their hotel grounds in the village of Machu Picchu with the goal of rescuing injured bears and reintroducing them into their natural habitat. Guests can see bears up close and learn about the challenges they face to survive in today's changing world. Their spectacled name derives from the yellowish white patches around their eyes. These elusive bears are more docile than their North American cousins, they are not a threat to humans and famously served as inspiration for the beloved Paddington Bear children's book character!

## Ecuador & Peru are available this summer and fall

#### ECUADOR MAINLAND, GALAPAGOS ISLANDS & AMAZON

Ecuador & Galapagos are open to vaccinated travelers without the need for a Covid test. Unvaccinated travelers can also visit by showing a negative PCR or Antigen test issued 72 hours prior to arrival. The US Travel Advisory recently downgraded Ecuador, and most of our Latin America destinations, to a Level 3 and the Government of Ecuador aims to vaccinate the entire adult population of the country by end of August. In Galapagos, close to 100% of the eligible population is already fully vaccinated including cruise ship and hotel crew and guides. You can choose from 5-8 day cruises on ships ranging in size from 16 to 100 passengers or a more private hotel based stay in the islands. For family groups, we can arrange a charter of a 16 passenger luxury catamaran or a private villa on Santa Cruz Island.

#### **PERU**

The world renowned Inca Trail re-opens July 15, 2021 with permits on sale starting June 25. The trekking season runs April through November. Currently Machu Picchu is open with a limited capacity of 667 visitors per day (down from the normal 2,500 per day). However, in reality only about 100 people are actually entering a day, so this summer and fall offers a once-in-a lifetime opportunity to experience Cusco, the Sacred Valley and the Lost City of the Incas without the typically crowds. Be one of the first to trek the Inca Trail and witness the vibrant plant life, birds and animal species who have enjoyed the site to themselves during the Covid shut-down. A family who recently returned from Peru with Southwind only saw about 30 other hikers on their Inca Trail dayhike. This shorter route leads directly to the citadel from Km104 providing a short cut to the 4 day trek that normally sees 500 hikers a day.

Peru is a year-around destination with a dry season April-November. Lima is a 5½ hour flight from Miami. Before or after visiting Machu Picchu, consider adding <u>Lake Titicaca</u> or a <u>luxury riverboat cruise</u> on the <u>Amazon</u> or staying in a <u>rainforest lodge</u> with an optional night spent in a secluded treehouse.
